
What an ideal and winning consortium?



Identify the true **key opinion leaders** (KOLs) within your field or topic



Setting up a consortium that combines partners from **various disciplines**



Geographical spread of the partners and balance between profit and non-profit partners



Each Partner should have a unique role, ovoid redundancy



Steps to build your consortium

- 1. Establish a core consortium with high excellence
- ✓ Bring on board the **Key Opinion Leaders** within the specific field or topic and establish **a core consortium**

- 2. Develop your excellent Plan
- ✓ Together with this core consortium draft the scope, main objectives and rough outline of the project

- 3. Bring in the rest of the partners
- ✓ Start building the rest of the consortium from this core
- ✓ Use your network, or those of the core consortium members.
- ✓ Use Partnering tools/Networks



Tips to find partners for your project proposal

- 1) Search your social media: Being active on social media means that you are going to have access to the information on a large number of potential partners.
- 2) Go to networking events: Try to exchange contact information with as many of those potential partners as possible to increase your chances of finding the right ones
- 3) Use your email marketing strategy: The email marketing strategy is something that most organizations neglect. Write a smart and descriptive email to your previous partners if you already participated in other projects
- **4) Join online networks :** Several networks gather partners from European and non-European Countries. Add your organization to this network, you are immediately going to gain access to information about a plethora of different organizations that could be your partners.
- 5) Use Partnering tools: Several Partnering tools allow to you to register or to search for partners using their database

NCP - Horizon Europe



The network of National Contact Points (NCPs) is the main structure to provide guidance, practical information and assistance on all aspects of participation in Horizon Europe. NCPs are also established in many non-EU and non-associated countries ("third countries").



NCP Services

In general, the following basic services are available in accordance with the NCP Guiding Principles agreed by all countries:

- Guidance on choosing relevant Horizon Europe topics and types of action
- 2. Advice on administrative procedures and contractual issues
- Training and assistance on proposal writing
- 4. Distribution of documentation (forms, guidelines, manuals etc.)
- 5. Assistance in partner search

As the NCPs are national structures, the type and level of services offered may differ from country to country.
