

RULES OF CONTEST - 2024

PRIMA Woman Greening Food Systems Award in the Mediterranean Region



1. THEME PRIMA Award

1.1 Objectives pursued

PRIMA "Woman Greening Food Systems Award in the Mediterranean Region" recognizes and celebrates the outstanding contributions of the Mediterranean women in promoting sustainable and resilient food systems. The prizes are to recognise and uplift the essential role women play in innovating and transforming sustainable food systems in the Mediterranean region. The award intends to spotlight these women and their initiatives, aiming to augment visibility and thus empowering women across the region to continue their significant contributions towards the future of sustainable and resilient food systems. Beyond this, the award is envisioned to foster further innovation within green food systems and advance gender equality within the food systems sector.

1.2 Expected Results

With this award, PRIMA aims to champion significant strides led by women in driving positive change within the food and agriculture sector in the Mediterranean Region.

2. PRIZE AMOUNT(S):

PRIMA will award two winners with a recognition prize of 10 000 EUR each.

In addition, PRIMA will further promote the winners, by inviting them to provide testimony at other major events.

3. DEADLINES & ADMISSIBILITY

Joint applications by a group of participants are admitted. In this case, the participants must appoint a female as 'Lead Participant' to represent them towards PRIMA. The participants will be jointly responsible and must all fulfil and respect the conditions set out in these Rules of Contest.

Applications must be readable, accessible and printable. Incomplete applications may be considered inadmissible if essential elements are missing (see Section 5.1.5 of the AWP2024 = $\frac{\text{https://prima-med.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/01/AWP2024.pdf}}$).

The applications must be created by the Lead Participant and consists of two main parts:

- Part I: the Administrative Data (to be filled directly on the electronic submission system, ESS, and uploaded as well using Part I template as PDF), and
- Part II: the Application Form, which is the description of green solution. The page-limit for your prize application (Part II) is: max 10 pages and to be uploaded as a PDF.

NON-COMPULSORY: If the participants have previously created an audio-visual material (i.e. video) that reflects on how they used the research results to create societal benefits, they may include an online link to this already existing video (max 90 seconds). The video will not be evaluated as part of the application but it may be used by PRIMA for its communication and publicizing activities.

In accordance with article 8.2.2. of Rules of Contest, participants can include this link under the section' Other Information' in the Template Part II. This is NOT a compulsory requirement.

4. ELIGIBILITY

4.1 Eligibility criteria

The contest is open to all women and/or legal and/or groups of legal entities (i.e. natural or legal persons, including international organisations) led by women. The contestants for the PRIMA prizes should be <u>at least</u> one legal entity established in a PRIMA Participating States (PS).² The demonstrated practices must be implemented in the Mediterranean Region at one of the PRIMA PS.

Prizes will not be awarded to teams including employees of PRIMA or serving on one of the PRIMA advisory committees (Scientific Advisory Committee) or Governing boards (Board of Trustees and Steering Committee).

Please also be aware that participants that have already received an EU or Euratom prize cannot receive a second prize for the same activities.

4.2 Exclusion criteria

Participants will be excluded if they (or one of them):

- A) are subject to an administrative sanction (i.e. exclusion)³
- B) are in one of the following situations⁴:
- bankrupt, being wound up, having their affairs administered by the courts, entered into an arrangement with creditors, suspended business activities or subject to any other similar proceedings or procedures under national law (including persons with unlimited liability for the participant's debts)
- declared in breach of social security or tax obligations by a final judgment or decision (including persons with unlimited liability for the participant's debts)
- found guilty of grave professional misconduct⁴ by a final judgment or decision (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
- convicted of fraud, corruption, involvement in a criminal organisation, money laundering, terrorism-related crimes (including terrorism financing), child labour or human trafficking (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
- shown significant deficiencies in complying with main obligations under a procurement contract, grant agreement or grant decision financed by the EU or Euratom budget (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
- found guilty of irregularities within the meaning of Article 1(2) of Regulation No 2988/95 (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
- C) have misrepresented information required for participating in the contest or fail to submit such information

Professional misconduct includes: violation of ethical standards of the profession, wrongful conduct with impact on professional credibility, false declarations/misrepresentation of information, participation in a cartel or other agreement distorting competition,

D) were involved in the preparation of the prize documents and this entails a distortion of competition.

Contestants must:

- have no conflict of interests in connection with the prize; a conflict of interests could arise in particular as a result of economic interests, political or national affinity, family, emotional life or any other shared interest;
- F) inform the PRIMA Programme, without delay, of any situation considered a conflict of interests or which could give rise to a conflict of interests;
- G) have not been granted, and will not grant, have not sought and will not seek, have not attempted and will not attempt to obtain, and have not accepted and will not accept any advantage, financial or in kind, to or from any party whatsoever, where such advantage constitutes an illegal practice or involves corruption, either directly or indirectly, inasmuch as it is an incentive or reward relating to the award of the prize;

5. AWARD CRITERIA

The PRIMA Prize will be awarded to the entry(ies) that best addresses the following cumulative criteria:

Innovative Solutions for Greening Food Systems:

Demonstrated implementation of innovative solutions and practices proposed and led by women, specifically aimed at greening food systems in the Mediterranean region. This includes, but not limited to, pioneering approaches in agriculture, food production, and waste reduction that prioritize environmental sustainability, biodiversity conservation, and resource efficiency.

Evidence of Impactful Implementation:

Evidence of tangible outcomes resulting from the implementation of proposed solutions, showcasing measurable improvements in sustainability, resilience, and inclusivity within the food and agriculture sector. This could include quantifiable metrics such as reductions in carbon emissions, improvements in soil health, increased biodiversity, or enhanced food security and nutrition outcomes. It is essential to quantify the outcomes via measurable key indicators (for instance, number of beneficiaries and end-users, percentage of efficiency improvement....).

Women Empowerment for Green Food Systems:

Active engagement and empowerment of local communities and stakeholders, facilitated by women, in decision-making processes and project implementation specifically within the context of greening food systems. This involves fostering inclusive participation, ensuring equitable access to resources, providing opportunities for capacity building, and promoting leadership roles for women and marginalized groups in initiatives aimed at enhancing the sustainability and resilience of food systems.

DOCUMENTS

The mandatory supporting documents are set out in the application form.

Participants may be asked at a later stage for further documents (for legal entity validation, bank account validation, ethics review, declaration of honour on exclusion grounds, etc).

7. PROCEDURE

Each eligible application is evaluated remotely by independent experts (see Article 15 of the Horizon 2020 Rules for Participation Regulation no. 1290/2013), who carry out a technical evaluation on the basis of the criteria mentioned above. An Individual Evaluation Report, which includes comments and scores for all evaluation criteria, is prepared by each evaluator. The Jury members meet in a panel to discuss and rank the applications and select the best/high-ranked four applications (shortlisted) with highest scores to be invited for an interview.

The pre-selection Jury will evaluate each application against the three award criteria and score them as follows (half marks are possible decimals are not).

Criterion	Threshold	Maximum points
1. Innovative Solutions for Greening Food Systems	3	/5
2. Evidence of Impactful Implementation:	3	/5
3. Women Empowerment for Green Food Systems:	3	/5
Total	9	[/15]

For applications with the same score, the pre-selection Jury will determine a priority order according to the following approach: The score for the criterion No 3 will be given a weight of 1.5.

On the basis of the evaluation by the Jury, PRIMA will decide on the award of the prize. If two or more applications tie for the first rank, the price will be equally divided and awarded to all.

All participants will be informed the End of July 2024 on the outcome of their application.

8. OTHER CONDITIONS

8.1 Payment arrangements

The prize money (EUR 10.000) will be paid to the Winner(s) in one instalment after the award ceremony by bank transfer, provided all the requested documents have been submitted.

8.2 Publicity — Promoting the prize — Visibility of EU funding

8.2.1 Publicity by the winner(s)

Both finalist(s) and/winner(s) must promote the prize and its results, by providing targeted information to multiple audiences (including the media and the public) in a strategic and effective manner.

Unless the PRIMA requests or agrees otherwise or unless it is impossible, any communication activity related to the action (including in electronic form, via social media, etc.) must:

- (a) display both PRIMA logo and the EU emblem and
- (b) include the following text:

"This action/activity/person has been awarded the PRIMA Award "Woman Greening Food Systems Award in the Mediterranean Region" supported by the EU Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme".

When displayed together with another logo, the EU emblem and PRIMA logo must have appropriate prominence.

For the purposes of their obligations, the finalist(s) and winner(s) may use the PRIMA and EU emblem without first obtaining approval from PRIMA

This does not, however, give it the right to exclusive use.

Moreover, they may not appropriate the EU emblem or any similar trademark or logo, either by registration or by any other means.

8.2.2 Publicity by the PRIMA

PRIMA may use, for its communication and publicising activities, information relating to the action, documents notably summaries for publication as well as any other material, such as pictures or audio-visual material that it receives from the participants (including in electronic form).

PRIMA will publish the name of /both the finalist(s) and/the winner(s), their origin, the amount of the prize and its nature and purpose — unless they have requested to waive this publication (because disclosure risks threatening its security and safety or harm its commercial interest).

Photos and videos taken by PRIMA either in preparation of the award ceremony or during the award ceremony are the sole property of PRIMA.

8.3 Dissemination and exploitation of results

The winner(s) must comply with the obligations set out in Title III of the Horizon 2020 Rules for Participation Regulation No 1290/2013⁵

8.4 Processing of personal data

8.4.1 Processing of personal data by PRIMA

All personal data generated within the framework of this contest will be processed in accordance with PRIMA's privacy policy and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (EU) 2016/679.

All	/finalist(s) and/winner(s) consent that PRMA publish the following information:
	name
	PS of origin (address)
	their activities in relation to the award of the prize (via the summary for publication they provided)
	prize amount in whatever form and medium.

8.4.2 Processing of personal data by the participants

The participants must process personal data in compliance with applicable EU and national law on data protection (including authorisations or notification requirements, if any).

8.5 Ethics

The activities must be carried out in compliance with:

- (a) ethical principles (including the highest standards of research integrity) and
- (b) applicable international, EU and national law.

No prize will be awarded for activities carried out outside the EU, if they are prohibited in all Member States.

The participants must ensure that the activities have an exclusive focus on civil applications.

The participants must ensure that the activities do not:

(a) aim at human cloning for reproductive purposes

- (b) intend to modify the genetic heritage of human beings which could make such changes heritable (with the exception of research relating to cancer treatment of the gonads) or
- (c) intend to create human embryos solely for the purpose of research or for the purpose of stem cell procurement, including by means of somatic cell nuclear transfer.

The participants must respect the highest standards of research integrity — as set out, for instance, in the European Code of Conduct for Research Integrity⁶.

8.6 Conflict of interests

The participants must take all measures to prevent any situation where the impartial and objective award of the prize is compromised for reasons involving economic interest, political or national affinity, family or emotional ties or any other shared interest ('conflict of interests').

They must inform PRIMA without delay of any situation constituting or likely to lead to a conflict of interests and immediately take all the necessary steps to rectify this situation.

PRIMA may verify that the measures taken are appropriate and may require additional measures to be taken by a specified deadline.

8.7 Liability for damages

PRIMA cannot be held liable for any damage caused to the participants or to third parties as a consequence of the prize, including for gross negligence.

PRIMA cannot be held liable for any damage caused by any of the participants in the context of the prize.

8.8 Checks, audits and investigations

PRIMA, the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) and the European Court of Auditors may carry out checks, audits and investigations in relation to the prize.

8.9 Withdrawal of the prize — Recovery of undue amounts

PRIMA may withdraw the prize after its award and recover all payments made, if it finds out that:

- (a) false information, fraud or corruption was used to obtain it
- (b) a winner was not eligible or should have been excluded
- (c) a winner is in serious breach of its obligations under these Rules of Contest.

8.10 Administrative sanctions

If a participant has committed irregularities or fraud or has made false declarations, PRIMA may also:

- (a) exclude the participant from all future contracts, grants and contests financed from PRIMA for a maximum of five years (or 10 years in case of repetition) and/or
- (b) impose a financial penalty between 2% and 10% of the value of the prize (or between 4% and 20% in case of repetition).

8.11 Cancellation of the contest

PRIMA may cancel the contest or decide not to award the prize — without any obligation to compensate participants —, if:

- (a) no applications are received,
- (b) the Jury does not find a winner,
- (c) the winner is not eligible or must be excluded,
- (d) the objective of the contest has already been achieved,

8.12 Complaints

Complaints against decisions negatively affecting the rights of a participant or winner should follow the following procedure published on the PRIMA website (https://prima-med.org/documents-reports/).
