BACKGROUND & RATIONALE

The Mediterranean region faces interconnected challenges related to water scarcity, climate change, food and energy security, ecosystem degradation and fragmented governance. The WEFE Nexus provides a framework to address these interdependencies, but its practical application remains challenging. This session will explore how to move from conceptual approaches to concrete, cost-effective and actionable solutions, building on the Mediterranean region's growing experience and institutional momentum. The session will focus on evidence from implementation: what PRIMA projects have delivered in practice, where an integrated WEFE approach made a difference, what difficulties were encountered, and what conditions are needed for results to be taken up, replicated or adapted in other Mediterranean contexts..

OBJECTIVES

- **Strengthen the practical application** of the WEFE Nexus in the Mediterranean region.
- **Identify key barriers and enabling conditions** related to governance, policy coherence, financing and implementation.
- **Share good practices, tools and evidence** to support decision-makers and inform future investments and policies.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Policymakers and public authorities, international and regional organisations, research and innovation institutions, financing institutions, practitioners and technical experts, civil society and representatives of the water, energy, food and environmental sectors.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

The session will produce key messages and practical recommendations for advancing the operationalisation of the WEFE Nexus in the Mediterranean, including priority actions on governance, policy coherence, financing and implementation. The outcomes will contribute to a Euro-Mediterranean

contribution to the UN Water Conference in December 2026, through the Spanish Government (MITECO), and support further collaboration and follow-up actions in the region.
